Letter of Inquiry

Overview

Women Investing in Shepherd (WISH) is offering two community non-profit and two Shepherd University learning project grants for 2023. Grants from WISH are made possible by the generosity of its members who are committed to high-impact philanthropy. Grants are voted on by the active membership on an annual basis.

WISH inspires, educates, and develops the amazing potential of women's philanthropy. Our high-impact grants to Shepherd University and the tri-state community affect positive changes, bring new funding resources, and make philanthropy accessible.

Letters of Inquiry (LOI) are requested as the initial step in the grant process. Submission of LOI does not guarantee formal consideration for funding. Only groups selected by the Grants committee will be invited to submit full proposals.

2023 Grant Guidelines

WISH funds projects that address at least one of the following criteria:

- Responses to urgent and critical needs
- Bold new ventures; and/or
- New approaches to ongoing challenges

Eligibility

There are two separate grant pools with different criteria required for submission. You only need to meet the criteria for the pool to which you are applying.

Nonprofit: To be eligible for a grant from the community nonprofit pooled fund, a grantee must be a 501 (c) (3) organization and provide services in the following counties: Jefferson, Berkeley, Morgan, and Hampshire counties in WV; Frederick, Loudoun, and Clarke counties in VA; and Frederick and Washington counties in MD.

Shepherd Learning Program: To be eligible for a grant from the Shepherd University pooled fund, a grantee must be recognized as a Shepherd University academic, athletic, cultural, or community service program carried out by students, faculty, and/or staff, and sanctioned by the supervising Vice President/Dean and Office of Sponsored Research.

Additional Requirements and Exclusions:

- The grant application stipulates that the organization must expend the full amount of the WISH grant in a time span of no greater than three (3) years. We will not consider grants for lesser amounts than the grant award being offered.
- Applications from organizations that are part of a government agency (including public schools) will not be considered for a WISH grant.
- Applications from religious affiliated organizations that require religious activity or beliefs as part of the service or program requesting funding will not be considered for a WISH grant.
- Please do not submit any additional materials with the Letter of Inquiry. Any additional materials will be discarded.

LOI Due Date

All LOIs must **be received** by **March 10, 2023** to be considered. If you would like to receive a word version of the LOI, contact Meg Patterson at mpeterso@shepherd.edu (recommended). You may also copy and paste the LOI fields into a separate document. **All fields are required to be considered as a complete submission.** Please e-mail one copy of the LOI, a copy of IRS Determination letter (nonprofits *only*), a signed Statement of Sanction (Shepherd University Learning Projects *only*), and all attachments to mpeterso@shepherd.edu. You will receive an e-mail confirming receipt of your LOI submission.

For questions, call 304-876-5021. Request for full proposals will be issued by the beginning of April. If you are invited to submit a full proposal, the deadline for submission will be May 15, 2023.

Grant Size

Each **nonprofit** grant award (2 each) for the 2023 cycle will be \$35,500. Each **Shepherd learning project** grant award (2 each) for the 2023 cycle will be \$35,500. Applicants must show a need for use of the entire high impact amount in a time span of no greater than three (3) years.
