

Judee Ann Williams is the Global Head of Impact across CAA Sports, at leading entertainment and sports agency, Creative Artists Agency (CAA). While overseeing Impact across Sports, she is also the global lead of CAA Social Impact, a strategic consulting team that sits at the intersection of CAA's deeply experienced Brand Consulting and highly connected Foundation groups. A 20-year veteran of CAA, she formerly ran the CAA Foundation.

Williams consults with individuals and organizations on their philanthropic and pro-social initiatives. She has advised clients including Google, Walmart, KPMG, The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Reebok, the Alzheimer's Association, Hudson's Bay Company, Rent the Runway, Cartier, and EverFi, among others.

She worked alongside NFL client J.J. Watt to facilitate the almost \$42 million raised with his record-setting crowdfunding campaign after Hurricane Harvey, the largest crowdfunding campaign by an individual to date. She brought together Boys & Girls Club alongside Katy Perry for her *Witness Tour*, and for Beyoncé and Jay-Z's *On The Run II* Tour, where the pair awarded a total of \$1.1 million in scholarships.

Additionally, Williams is a prominent member of the philanthropic community. Williams is on the Board of Trustees of Save the Children, and holds various appointments on boards and advisory councils, including the Board of the Carrie Underwood C.A.T.S. Foundation, Katy Perry's Firework Foundation, First Book, ACM Lifting Lives and the USO Entertainment Council. During the Obama Administration, she supported the entertainment councils for both the White House and United Service Organizations.

A longtime supporter of the Armed Forces, Williams is actively involved with the USO, Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America, as well as the St. Bernard Project.



Williams was named to Variety's 2019 Power of Women New York Impact List and a Champion for Children in 2019 by Boys & Girls Club of America. In 2013, she was named to Glamour Magazine's 35 under 35 "Women to Watch in Entertainment." She has also been featured in Vogue, and has presented at the Sundance Film Festival, SXSW, and at the Fast Company Innovation festival.

Williams received her B.A. in Political Science with a minor in Business from Shepherd University. Williams also received the 2020 Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from Shepherd University.
